

How to Enter

PAVILIONS COMPETITION ENTRY FEES

- ⇒ Entry Fee: \$2.00 per item (EARLY BIRD SPECIAL: Register by June 1 and save \$1 per entry)
- ⇒ Please note: you will not receive any gate admission tickets with your entries. If you wish to visit the fair or pick up your entries, you will need to purchase a ticket.
- ⇒ Porkchop Pass: enter 15+ items and receive a 1 day ticket to the fair! Tickets will be emailed to the email provided upon registration, following the close of registration the week of July 9.

STEP BY STEP INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1: REVIEW THE COMPETITIONS HANDBOOK

Read the show rules for each department you would like to enter and determine the DIVISION NUMBER and CLASS NUMBER for each entry



STEP 2: ENTER ONLINE

- ⇒ Entries are only accepted online.
- ⇒ Visit Icfair.com and go to the "Competitions" page to enter online.
- ⇒ If you do not have access to a computer, need assistance entering online, or do not have a credit/debit card and wish to pay by check or cash, please call the Fair Office at (847) 680-7200 to schedule an appointment.
- ⇒ Online Entries **OPEN**: **Monday, May 1 at 9:30 a.m.**
- ⇒ Online Entries CLOSE: Sunday, July 9 at 11:59pm (EXCEPT Flower and Garden departments which close on Sunday, July 23 at 11:59pm). Late entries will be accepted through drop-off times (\$50 late fee per item applies)

STEP 3: TAG PICK-UP & ENTRY DELIVERY

- ⇒ Entry tags will be available at check-in when you drop off your entries. If you wish to pick up your tags prior to drop-off, please call the Fairgrounds office to schedule a pickup time.
- ⇒ Entry drop-off dates and times vary per department. See page 2 for entry delivery dates/times.

STEP 4: ENTRY & PREMIUM CHECK PICK-UP

- ⇒ Items may not be removed prior to department release time.
- ⇒ Once your department is judged, you may retrieve your items on Sunday, July 30 from 6:00 –
 7:00pm. You will need to purchase a ticket to enter the fairgrounds on Sunday 7/30!
- ⇒ Prize Money: If you placed and receive a monetary prize, premium checks will be mailed the week of August 7. All winners must have a social security number on file if prize winnings are \$600.00 or higher—no exceptions.

General Information

- 1. Competitions are open to all Lake County and non-Lake County residents.
- 2. All judging decisions are final. Judges reserve the right to not award winners for all places.
- 3. There are no limits for entry per class, but where applicable no duplicate entries or exactly the same items.
- 4. All exhibitors will need to purchase a fair ticket in order to pick-up their entries on Sunday. No exceptions.
- 5. Each entry must have been completed within the past two calendar years (Example: For 2023 competitions, entries must have been completed in 2022, 2021, or after August 2020). Please enter the class of the current age of the exhibitor, NOT age when entry was created.
- 6. Entries may not have received any award placement in previous Lake County Fair Pavilion Departments (4-H exhibit is exempt as it is not part of Pavilions).
- 7. If you have any questions about your specific department (judging criteria, which division/class to enter, etc.), please contact the department Superintendent via email: lcfair.pavilion.info@gmail.com
- 8. Entries cannot be changed or voided once they have been submitted, unless superintendent sees fit. No refunds.
- 9. Additional entries will be accepted at time of delivery for a \$50 late fee per item.
- 10. Entries will only be accepted during the designated drop-off dates/times. Entries not delivered within the designated times will <u>not</u> be accepted or judged.
- 11. An entry tag must accompany each exhibit. Please remove the claim ticket on the bottom of the tag, write a description of the item for you to easily identify the piece it belongs to and keep in a safe place until Sunday for pick up. The bottom of the tag with your name must be folded during judging. <u>AFTER JUDGING, ALL EXHIBITOR TAGS WILL BE OPENED AND EXHIBITORS' NAMES WILL BE DISPLAYED THROUGHOUT THE DURATION OF THE FAIR.</u>
- 12. General security will be provided throughout the period of the Fair, but the Lake County Fair Association and any of its agents, officers, directors or members will not be responsible for loss or damage to any property, nor will the Lake County Fair Association be held responsible for personal loss or injury from fire, theft or injury, or any other cause in connection with or during the Fair. If an item is of importance to you, we suggest you insure the item.
- 13. Exhibitor grants the Lake County Fair Association the right, without compensation, to use Exhibitor's name, likeness, recipe, and entry photos in connection with advertising or promoting the Lake County Fair.
- 14. ALL DEPARTMENTS: The Superintendents reserve the right to reject any entry and/or place into the appropriate class/division.
- 15. ENTRY RELEASE: Unless otherwise stated in the Department rules, no Pavilion entries may be removed from the Fairgrounds until 6:00 p.m. on Sunday.
- 16. Please bring your claim ticket to retrieve your entry.
- 17. The Fair Office cannot take responsibility for any entries not picked up by 7:00 p.m. on Sunday.
 - Pavilion competitors may <u>not</u> drive their vehicles on the Fairgrounds to retrieve their entries. Please bring assistance or a cart if you have multiple or heavy items. No exceptions.



Entry Delivery

- Entries will only be accepted during the designated drop-off dates/times. Entries not delivered within the designated times will not be accepted or judged.
- An entry tag must accompany each exhibit. Entry tags will be available at check-in when
 you drop off your entries. If you wish to pick up your tags prior to drop-off, please call the
 Fairgrounds office to schedule a pickup time.
 - Please remove the claim ticket on the bottom of the tag, write a description of the item for you to easily identify the piece it belongs to and keep in a safe place until Sunday for pick up.
 - The bottom of the tag with your name must be folded during judging.
 - AFTER JUDGING, ALL EXHIBITOR TAGS WILL BE OPENED AND EXHIBITORS' NAMES WILL BE DISPLAYED THROUGHOUT THE DURATION OF THE FAIR.

- 3. Exhibits should be free from worms, insects and disease damage.
- 4. No water containers are to be used in any of the exhibits.
- 5. Plates will be furnished and will be available at entry drop-off.
- 6. Exhibits will be judged on condition, freshness, maturity, size, shape, color and uniformity.
- 7. Divisions 400-404 are for **amateur/backyard gardeners only!** Anyone who has grown vegetables or farmed professionally is prohibited from these divisions. Professionals may enter Division 406.

An attractive basket of the exhibitor's choice containing five to seven different varieties of fruit. The display will be judged on quality and assortment of fruit, arrangement of fruit, and neatness and attractiveness as a whole.

2-Vegetable Basket

An attractive basket of the exhibitor's choice containing eight to ten varieties of vegetables. The basket will be judged on quality and assortment of vegetables, arrangement of vegetables, and neatness and attractiveness as a whole.

3-Salad Plate

A plate or wooden tray of the exhibitor's choice displaying lettuce and four other vegetables suitable for use in a tossed salad, such as tomato, cucumber, carrot, radish, endive, cauliflower, broccoli, etc.

4-Soup Bowl

A bowl of the exhibitor's choice containing five different vegetables grown primarily for their edible roots, such as potato, onion, carrot, beet, turnip, parsnip, etc. Root crops will be shown with 2" tops.

5-Fruit Bowl

A bowl of the exhibitor's choice containing five fruits including the exhibitor's choice of apple, peach, pear, plums, currant, and grapes.

- 1. PLEASE REVIEW PAGES 4-6 BEFORE MAKING AN ENTRY
- 2. All flowers must have been grown by the exhibitors.
- 3. All potted plants must be owned by exhibitor for three (3) months prior to the Fair registration deadline.
- 4. Exhibitors must furnish appropriate container (vase, bottle, or jar).
- 5. No arrangements will be accepted in this show.
- 6. Gladiolus refers to cut stem in proportion to flower part of stalk.
- 7. Exhibits will be judged on flower, stem, foliage and presentation.
- 8. Stems should be cut as long as possible.
- 9. "SPRAY" refers to three (3) or more blossoms.
- 10. Exhibits should contain three (3) to five (5) stems unless noted.
- 11. Flowers should be displayed in a proportionally sized vase.
- 12. Exhibitors are encouraged to maintain/replace flowers as needed throughout the Fair. The Superintendent may replace any wilted or dying flower if the Exhibitor does not maintain.

Floral Arrangement Show Rules and Special Instructions

2023 Theme: It's Kind of a Pig Deal

1. PLEASE REVIEW PAGES 4-6 BEFORE MAKING AN ENTRY

- 2. Please note entry delivery dates and times!
- 3. This show is for arrangements. The show is for amateurs only! Anyone who has arranged flowers part-time or professionally is prohibited from the show. A professional is anyone who has been self-employed as a florist or worked for a florist.
- 4. Accessories are permitted in arrangement divisions as noted.
- Flowers must be dominant in arrangements. Line material can be fresh, dried, or painted.
- 6. THE ARTIST SHOULD KEEP IN MIND DESIGN, COLOR, HARMONY, PROPORTION AND STYLE.
- 7. "Fresh" is defined as bought/purchased; "Garden" is defined as grown by exhibitor.
- 8. No dried flower arrangements.
- 9. No plastic or cloth flowers or foliage allowed in designs. Fresh flowers or garden grown only.
- 10. All arrangements will be staged on step shelves. No arrangement is to exceed 36" high, 36" wide and 12" deep.
- 11. If an arrangement division has an asterisk (*), no accessories may be used other than a base or as indicated in a specific class.
- 12. Exhibitors are encouraged to maintain/replace flowers as needed throughout the Fair. The Superintendent may replace any wilted or dying flower if the Exhibitor does not maintain.

DIVISION 420 - MASTER ARRANGEMENTS

*No accessories except those specified in the class description. Live or dried line material plus a base are permitted and are encouraged. No backgrounds are permitted. No mechanical devices allowed.

2023 Theme: It's Kind of a Pig Deal

Class 1: Year of the Pig —a Asian-inspired design using fresh or garden flowers in a container of your choice, no accessories.*

Class 8: Getting Piggy With It – (Roger Flood Memorial Challenge) - Open to anyone but only one entry per household. Using garden flowers in a beer stein or mug, not to exceed 18 inches in height.* Garden flowers only.

The Roger W. Flood Memorial Challenge remembers a man (1943-97) whose name was synonymous with Lake County Fair flowers. He served in Germany in the U.S. Army and here is where his love of flowers began. In the 1980°-1990°, he grew the Fair flower show from a corner stand to one of the largest in the area.



- 1. PLEASE REVIEW PAGES 4-6 BEFORE MAKING AN ENTRY
- All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
- 3. Any items entered in Canning, Pickling, Jams, Preserves, Jellies and Honey classes will be judged on a 4oz or larger jar. The entry tag should be attached around the jar below the lid. Canning must have been done since the previous Lake County Fair. All jars will be opened for judging.
- 4. All baked goods must be made from scratch. No store bought items can be used unless noted. If any culinary item does not meet department rules, it will be disqualified by the Judge or Superintendent.
- 5. All entries (except Divisions 650, 651, and 652 —Canning, Pickling, Honey, Jams, Preserves, and Jellies) must include on a 3x5 index card a list of the ingredients used. On the top line please write the Division, class number, & category entry is registered under. Attach index card to the back of the entry tag so it is easy to read.
- 6. Decorating/Art and Specialty entries (divisions 659 and 660 classes) may be store bought items, although homemade is preferred. Approved containers may consist of clear Ziplock bags, clear plasticware (to-go style containers with clear lids), tins with see-through tops, mason jars or original store packaging when applicable.
- 7. All tags should indicate age group: Adult (22 or older), Young Adult (14-21), Junior (8-13), Youth (7 and under) on back of tag. Secure all entry tags by taping to the outside of any bag, wrapped item or disposable container. Tags can be tied by placing a hole punch on the outside of the bag, but still allow entry for the judges into the bag.
- 8. All exhibits must be ready for display as specified in division description. Make sure entries are correctly wrapped, bagged, tagged (tag can be taped to item), in the correct amount and in the correct container, plate or size indicated.
- 9. The "Special Notes" listed in some divisions are considered part of the Culinary Show Rules and must be adhered to by all exhibitors.


